BEFORE THE COMPETITION

- Create the Orion match file in advance.
- Enable the Result Center, allowing shooters and coaches to find match results online.
- As entries come in, add the competitors, coaches, and teams directly into Orion.
- Use descriptive team names. "West Potomac" instead of "WPHS."
- Organize competitors into relays.
- Keep the number of shooters per relay at a manageable level.
- The day before the match pre-print barcode labels. Apply the barcodes to the targets for distribution.

The best way to ensure your competition runs smoothly is to use Orion in day to day training. The more you practice with Orion the smoother your match will run.

DURING THE COMPETITION

- Have at least one assistant available who can help manage targets, find coaches to answer questions, hang printed results, and so on.
- Resolve all highlighted targets before printing results.
- Display the online results using a projector or large screen TV.
- After each relay, print individual score sheets for the athletes. Arrange the targets with the score sheets for collection by the athletes or coaches.





PROTEST PROCEDURES

INDIVIDUAL SCORE SHEETS

After firing is complete and targets are scored shooters may have access to their targets and individual score sheets.

CHECKING FOR OBVIOUS ERRORS

Shooters may ask the stat officer (Orion operator) to check for an obvious error on a particular shot. If the stat officer agrees he or she may make a manual correction without the need to file a formal protest.

An obvious error is when the found shot is not a reasonable interpretation of the actual shot. The printed scoring rings may not be used to determine if a scored shot is an obvious error.

SHOOTERS MAY VIEW THE SHOT WITHIN ORION


If the stat officer believes the shot was correctly scored the shooter may then view the shot within Orion. This is to help the shooter decide if he or she wants to protest. The shooter may not make an argument that the shot is an obvious error.

PROTESTING THE SHOT

The shooter must decide quickly to protest or not to protest the shot. If protesting, the stat officer runs the protest algorithm on the shot. If the protest is lost a two point penalty must be applied under USAS and Council rules.
